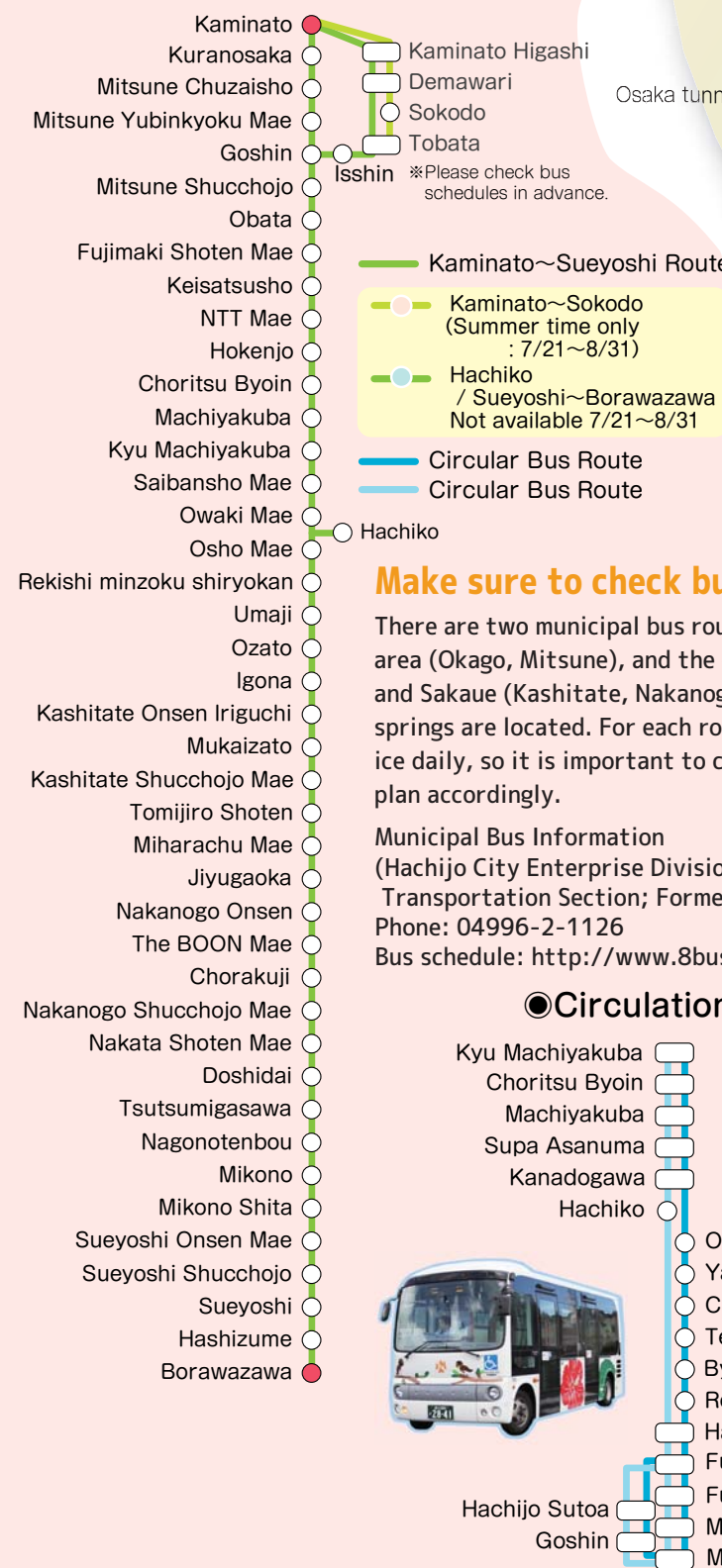

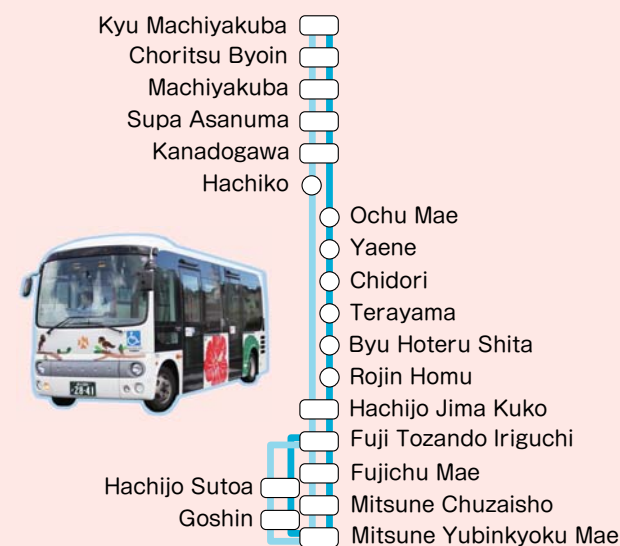


Make sure to check bus times in advance!

There are two municipal bus routes: one circles the Sakashita area (Okago, Mitsune), and the other runs between Sakashita and Sakaue (Kashitate, Nakanogo, Sueyoshi), where the hot springs are located. For each route, about six buses are in service daily, so it is important to check bus times in advance and plan accordingly.

Sueyoshi Miharashi-no-yu

Miharashi-no-yu (which means "bath with a view") is located at the south-east tip of the island and offers a spectacular view of the ocean. Borawazawa was the first hot spring to open in Hachijo and is popular among surfers.

Nakanogo Hot Spring Village

Many popular hot springs are concentrated in the Nakanogo area, including The BOON, equipped with whirlpool tubs and sauna facilities: Yasuragi-no-yu, known for its view and therapeutic qualities: Uramigataki, which couples and families can enjoy in their bathing suits; and Kirameki, a foot bath overlooking the waters of Aigae.

BU.S.PA -
your passport to hot spring paradise!

Ride buses and enjoy hot springs for only 1,000 yen (2days)!

BU.S.PA is valid for two days from the date of purchase, during which you are free to ride the municipal bus and visit most hot spring facilities as many times as you wish.

BU.S.PA costs 1,000 yen for adults and 500 yen for children, and can be purchased from the bus driver or at the Municipal Bus Ticket Window located in Former Town Hall.

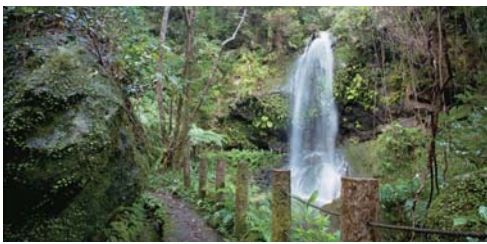

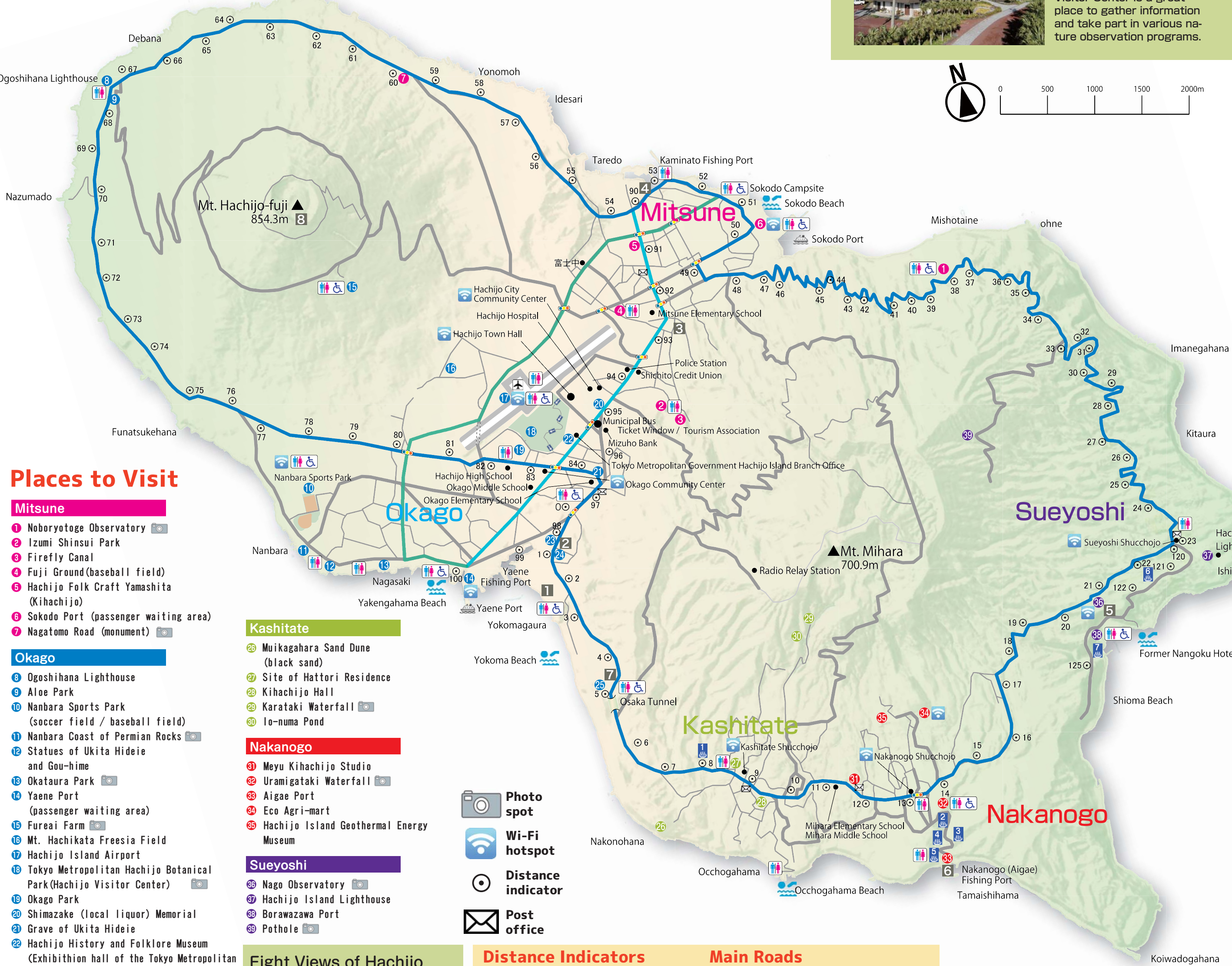
